EXPLORING THE INTELLECTUAL AND FINANCIAL DIMENSION OF WELLNESS!

Le Jardin staff made vision boards and journals to set in motion their goals for 2024.

The intellectual dimension of wellness includes having an active and curious mind. Head Start programs support intellectual wellness by recognizing that each staff member brings creative abilities, talents, and interests to their work. Staff have opportunities to examine their strengths and areas of growth and work together with their supervisors to develop professional development plans that expand their knowledge and improve their skills.

The financial dimension of wellness includes being financially well, understanding financial processes, and having access to resources to support financial stability. Head Start programs offer support to staff for their financial health by sharing financial resources, scheduling community members to speak with staff in a group or one-onone for budgeting and other fiscal advice, and helping staff make the most of their benefits packages and take advantage of fiscal planning resources in the community.
