Le Jardin is an Early Learning organization with several locations in Homestead / Florida City, Florida. Le Jardin opened in 1986 and since then has grown to 7 Centers and one administration office, employing approximately 300 employees, providing services year-round under Head Start, Early Head Start, Voluntary Pre-k, School Readiness, and Parenting programs. Currently, Le Jardin annually serves over 816 infants, toddlers, preschool, pregnant women and families. The families come from diverse backgrounds, but all have incomes falling below the Federal Poverty guidelines.











Le Jardin effectively supports children in the following areas:

- •Assists families with finding a medical and dental home.
- •Partners with community providers to locate sources of funding for health and dental services including Medicaid and private insurances.
- Connects families to sources for Medical Services.
- •Tracks and monitors health and nutrition services.
- •Offers opportunities for parent training to promote overall health in areas such as child health, nutrition, development, prenatal care, gardening and environmental hazards.

Comprehensive Services

In addition, Le Jardin provides the following services to infants, toddlers, and preschoolers enrolled in the program:

- Developmental screenings for vision, hearing, and growth. The screenings identify areas of concern regarding the child's development and sensory skills, while remaining sensitive to the child's cultural and linguistic background.
- · Individual Health Plans is the documentation provided by the primary physician indicating specific accommodations in the classrooms to meet the health and nutrition needs of all children.
- All children with nutritional concerns, such as allergies and/or special diets, receive modified menus with food substitutions, taking into consideration all aspects of the child's development.







Le Jardin continues to meet the nutrition needs of the children enrolled, ensuring children receive two-thirds of their daily caloric requirements. (Breakfast, lunch, and snack) funded through the U.S Department of Agriculture Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP).



Mental Health and Disability

We at Le Jardin Community Center Inc. are dedicated to the overall well-being of children in our care. According to the CDC "Mental health in childhood means reaching developmental and emotional milestones, and learning healthy social skills and how to cope when there are problems." In the Mental Health Component, we refer children for mental health services in our partnering agencies as well as provide on-site mental health care and psychoeducation.



This year we are having to deal with COVID-19. Not every child responds to stress in the same way and they may exhibit symptoms in different ways. Some of the symptoms to watch out for are:

- 1. Irritability and excessive crying.
- 2. Poor eating and sleeping habits.
- Unexplained headaches and body aches.
- 4. Returning to behaviors they have outgrown.
- 5. Worry and sadness that's excessive.



If a parent suspects a child of suffering with a mental health disorder the parent should.

- 1. Talk to their Pediatrician
- 2. Discuss with teach or Family Worker
- 3. Get a referral for mental health counseling
- 4. Join a support group










Prenatal Academy

Positive Parenting Program "Triple P"

Le Jardin Community Center's Parenting Program is funded by the Children's Trust - a dedicated source of revenue stablished by voter referendum to improve the lives of children and families in Miami-Dade County.

The parenting curriculum involves a Parent Pre- Post Assessment, (Incredible Years), Parent Practices Interview, A Pre-Post Assessment (SDQ), and a Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire.

There are four two-hour workshop/training sessions, followed by three individualized phone conferences culminating in a final family strengthening event that involves Closing Program/ Graduation for a total of 8 sessions.

At the end of the Triple P Program, parents have learned a total of seventeen strategies in which they continue to use in High Risk Situations.



Parent Involvement

Parents and Community Partners Transform Gardens at Le Jardin

Early Head Start and Head Start children learn by experiencing "hands on" learning and by having opportunities to plant their gardens, re-visit the gardens, and talk about their experiences. Gardening includes science and nature when exploring and nutrients to help the plant grow, math when measuring the growth and even counting seeds. Children also are exposed to stories, activities, drawing and additional social skills when collaborating and working with other children and adults.

Teachers and parents learned that meaningful exploration can provide children the chance to practice taking care of the garden, and the opportunity to discover new things. Le Jardin children have a positive gardening experience from seeds, planting or taking care of the plants as they grow and produce vegetables and herbs.

Parents and community partners come together each school year to help sustain or transform the gardens so that children can continue to learn healthy eating habits and experience farm to table.























Parent Involvement

Encouraging Literacy Developmentwith the Help of Community Partners

Le Jardin understands the importance of early literacy, whether in the home or in the classroom. For example, reading to a child for 15-20 minutes a day can be one of the most critical literacy preparation phase. Early literacy nurtures an array of vocabulary, language development, and early literacy skills. Reading to a child also builds the child's confidence and develops social and emotional skills in preparation for school readiness.

Stories, verbal communication, singing, and rhyme games also contribute to literacy development. Guest readers introduce the title, author, and have the children describe the pictures, read the story and use a series of questions to generate responses. Guest readers included parents, local police and fire department, military personnel, and other community partners.

Le Jardin Community Center, Inc. Head Start/Early Head Start Program understands the importance of having qualified staff. Of the 24 Head Start Teachers, 100% have a Bachelor's Degree or higher in Early Childhood Education or another field with equivalent coursework in Early Childhood Education.

Human Resources

An extensive Onboarding Program ensures that new staff are well trained before working with children and families. The Onboarding Program is a week-long New Hire Orientation that includes videos and training on the Head Start Program Performance Standards, Head Start Act, History and Philosophy of Head Start, Family Engagement and Community Impact, History of Le Jardin, and Policies and Procedures.

The program also understands that qualified staff must stay abreast of current trends in their field of expertise. Thus, a great deal of effort is placed on professional development opportunities, some of which include: attendance at local and out-of-town conferences and workshops, in-house workshops, workshops conducted at Pre-Service Training Conferences, and accredited college coursework.

The employment of qualified staff has enabled Le Jardin Community Center, Inc. Head Start/Early Head Start Program to provide quality services to children, families and the communities in which we serve.

Staff Professional Development

Le Jardin creates professional development plans with each employee to reflect agency goals and establish individual professional goals. Professional Development Plans have action steps and timelines which are updated at least biannually to ensure progress and outcomes.

Our teaching staff learn and develop new skills through peer support, mentor and Professional Learning Communities. coaching. online. and community partnerships. Professional development opportunities included Preschool CLASS, school readiness, using data to individualize learning and to implement program improvements across the agency. Professional Development opportunities for Infant and Toddler teachers help them build relationships and create environments necessary to support the development that will serve as the basis for school readiness, and for the development of a positive sense of self and relationships.

Professional Nevelopment

Teaching Staff and Curriculum Specialists



Implementing professional education development for our staff has benefits for both teachers and students. Professional development training can help teachers to become better at planning their time and staying organized, providing services to children through instruction opportunities and support, working with children with concerns and special needs, a better understanding of child development and meeting their professional development needs outlines on their plans.

Le Jardin provides pre-service trainings each school year, workshops, trainings based on the staff needs and onboarding for new employees. Through mentoring and coaching, the Curriculum Specialist observe teachers, provide feedback and resources and work with the teachers on a weekly basis Training is also derived from the observations.








Information Technology

An unqualified opinion was issued on the financial audit and there were no findings on the single audit, with Le Jardin continuing to be considered a low-risk auditee.
