## Caribbean Gmerican Hertage Mouth

In June of 2005, the House of Representatives "unanimously" voted on the bill that Congresswoman Barbara Lee presented for Caribbean Heritage Month. This bill recognized the history of Caribbean people, their significance, and their culture. On February 14, 2006, the resolution passed the senate. On June 6th, 2006, President George W. Bush issued a proclamation declaring June as Caribbean American Heritage Month. This year marks 15 years since this event is celebrated in the United States.

On June 28, 2021, Dr. Mary, Manager of the MH/DS Component, celebrated this day with some of the staff at Le Jardin. In order to build team cohesion, promote health and mental wellness, and celebrate success, Dr. Mary presented an atmosphere of fun and laughter with a Caribbean feel. Dr. Mary and the staff decorated the open area of Center 1 with palm leaves, balloons, and bright-colored streamers. Caribbean appetizers were served with Martinelli's Sparkling Cider and homemade Caribbean lemonade.

Activities included a "Dollar Wine" dance contest (a classic Soca song and dance), a limbo contest (bending your back to go under a lowered stick; a contest enjoyed at traditional Caribbean parties and tourists' events), and a Caribbean trivia quiz. Prizes were given to the first and second place winners of each activity. Staff reported that they were able to enjoy themselves after a long school year and experience other staff members in a fun setting. "I feel like I'm on a cruise" shared Maria Rossiter and Maria Motta stated, "Now this is wellness."
